Dear Dr. Bongalos:

The College of Education has just put together a Centennial Celebration Committee (CCC) in preparation for the festivities and other activities that we will have to 1) honor the people that have germinated the College of Education seed and nurtured its growth through its one hundred years of service to the Philippines and beyond, 2) commemorate the significant events during its 100 years of existence, 3) celebrate the living and being of the College, and 4) give glory to God for the gift of education through the College of Education at Silliman.

As described by historian VPAA Dr. Earl Jude Paul Lirazan Cleope,

[t]he College of Education started as a department of Silliman Institute in 1919 offering the High School Teacher's Certificate (HST) and the Bachelor of Science in Education (BSE) curriculum, which was offered in 1920. In 1924, Silliman Institute granted its first Bachelor of Science in Education degrees to six of its graduates.... In 1935, a Board of Trustees Action reorganized the Department of Education into a college which was to have both undergraduate and graduate divisions, and designated the elementary and high school as laboratory schools... Dr. Clyde Heflin was appointed as the first dean.... (College of Education Graduate Program Handbook, 2012, p. 6).

The College of Education Centennial Celebration Committee (COE-CCC) has lined up several activities to launch the year-long celebration during the Founders Day Celebration this August. Among these is a variety show which will showcase the talents of the College of Education students, faculty, staff, and alumni. This will be held at the Luce Auditorium on Sunday, August 25 at 7-9PM.

In this regard, may we invite the Silliman Alumni (College of Education) of DepEd Schools Division of Negros Oriental to prepare an 8 to 10- minute presentation. This could be a combination of dancing, singing, or any other creative talent presentation. To facilitate the preparation of a coherent variety show concept, we have assigned each contingent a particular theme by decade from 1920 (the year when the College of Education first offered its Bachelor's degree program) to 2020 (our centennial year). The assignments are as follows:

1920's to 1930's: Teacher Education, Nutrition & Dietetics, and Physical Education and

Athletics

1940's to 1950's: DepEd Alumni

1960's to 1970's: SUSHS 1980's - 1990's: SUJHS 2000 - 2020: SUES

The following is the proposed timeline of practices:

July 29 (Monday): First practice, SU Gym Aug 5 (Monday): Second practice, SU Gym August 17 (Saturday): Final Rehearsal, SU Gym

August 25 (Sunday), 11 AM to 1 PM): Dress rehearsal, Luce Auditorium (Lunch will be

served.)

The expectation is that the various contingents/participants have already practiced their presentation before the July 29 first Variety show practice at the gym. Also, since we are all volunteering our time and other resources as a gesture of *pasalamat* to our college, costumes, snacks during contingent practices and other related expenses will be borne by the contingent. *Daghan kaayong salamat*.
