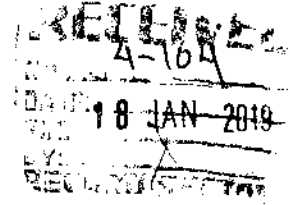

Interschool Current Events/News Quiz Bowl
February 18, 2019, 9 a.m

Rules and Guidelines

- One pair per school will compete in any given round. No substitutions may be made during a round. There will be seats for spectators, but teachers and coaches are asked to remain silent while there are students competing.
- Disqualification will be given to a pair who will be late in the start of the competition.
- Questions will be composed of news and current events (international, national and local news).
- Each team will compete in three rounds (Easy, Moderate and Difficult).
- The easy round will end when 10 questions have been read, followed by the average round with 5 questions and 3 questions for the difficult round.
- Scores on every round will be totalled at the end and winners will be ranked accordingly:
 - Easy- 1 point on each correct answer
 - Moderate- 3 points on each correct answer
 - Difficult- 5 points on each correct answer
- All ties will be broken using tiebreaker questions. The tiebreaker questions are worth no points. During each round, a moderator, a timer/scorekeeper, and a judge will be present. The first team to get the correct answer will be declared as winner.
- The moderator reads the questions and determines if responses are correct or incorrect
- Timer/Scorekeeper: Ensures that 30 seconds are given for each question, as well as keeping score and awarding bonus points.
- The Judge supervises the round and has the last word on any rules or issues that come up during play
- One member from each team must identify their school name to the scorekeeper and moderator at the beginning of the round.
- The moderator starts the round by beginning to read a question.
- The moderator reads a question and choices (for easy and average rounds) twice.
- After the question, the team will be given 30 seconds to finalize their answers and write it on the given answer boards.
- A signal will be given for all teams to raise their answer boards simultaneously.
- Prompting by coaches or audience members is strictly forbidden. If the judge suspects prompting, it is his or her right and responsibility to discard the question.
- Prompters or members of the audience who do not remain quiet will be asked to leave the room. If prompting has occurred, the participating team may be disqualified.
- No calculators, phones or computers are permitted.
- If a moderator misreads a question, the moderator may throw out the question due to error in delivery.
